Finally, a sincere thank you to the organizers of the December luncheon. It was fun to visit while enjoying a yummy lunch. It is always great to see everyone.

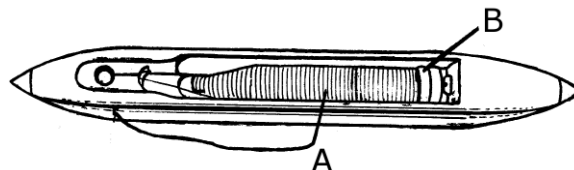

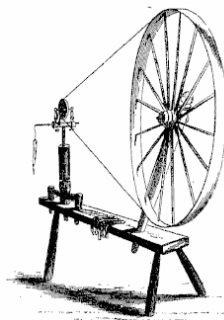
